WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Some of the highlights of the Opening Day Festivities feature the eagerly anticipated "Headcount" challenge, where brave individuals compete to down as many "turned," as possible. Participants must collect trophies from the turned, with tallies taken on Sunday to determine the first, second, and third place winners. It's a gruesome spectacle, but one that showcases the courage and resourcefulness of Sprawl's residents in the face of danger.

For those seeking even greater thrills, the "Gauntlet" offers a test of teamwork and endurance. Teams of up to five enter a rigged-up old elevator shaft system, where they must hit a button to bring in waves of turned, with each wave becoming increasingly challenging. The objective is simple: survive and clear as many levels as possible. Like Headcount, teams are judged based on their performance, with prizes awarded to the top finishers.

Controversy swirls around the "Nibble-Snatch" game, where participants enter a ring to snatch ribbons from a turned chained to a stake. Unarmed and with the turned's bloodlust unleashed, contestants must navigate the ring with skill and precision, risking disqualification with even the slightest scratch. However, clever competitors can gain an advantage by strategically removing their armor before entering, earning bonus ribbons while minimizing the risk of injury.

The "Triage" challenge pays homage to Sprawl's medical traditions, as teams compete to perform successful surgeries on an old training android. With key surgical items scattered around the hospital, participants must race against the clock to gather supplies and complete the operation, showcasing their medical expertise and teamwork in the process.
